



### Grand Caraïbe Martinique Invitational 2026 – General Information

The Regional Equestrian Committee of Martinique and the Equestrian Centre Equilibre in Le François, Martinique, invite you to the 2026 edition of the Grand Caraïbe. This competition will bring together Martinique, Guadeloupe, French Guyana, Suriname as well as special guests Jamaica, Bermuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Antigua and the Cayman Islands.

#### Competition: 3 Levels

Espoir: 75-85 cm/barrage 90 cm – 2 riders per delegation

Elite: 95-105 cm/barrage 110 – 2 riders per delegation

Grand Prix 110-115 cm/barrage 120 cm (Event reserved for invited coaches)

For the Grand Caraïbe Challenge the performance of 2 Espoir riders and 2 Elite riders will be considered.

#### Program:

Tuesday, February 10: Arrival of delegations

Wednesday, February 11: Afternoon Horse Trial

Thursday, February 12: Recreation Day

Friday, February 13: Competition Day 1

Saturday, February 14: Competition Day 2

Sunday, February 15: Departure of delegations

**Costs:** Athletes are responsible for the following costs:

- Coaching fee - \$800 (per athlete, complete price for competition)
- Share of coach airfare – to be divided amongst athletes
- Federation administrative fee - \$300
- Accommodation fee - €200 payable in cash on arrival in Martinique. (This year the organizing committee is asking for a financial contribution of €200 per rider for delegations that do not host the competition on their territory)
- Round trip airfare and baggage costs
- Taxi transfers if applicable
- Meals (Breakfast, lunch and dinner)

The following are subsidized by the Federation:

- Accommodation for COACHES ONLY (double occupancy per room)
- Horse Rental Fees
- Competition Entry Fees
